

NORTH POLE RADIO NEWS - TRANSCRIPT

Elf Holly Berry: Greetings! I'm Elf Holly Berry reporting from the Special Assignment Desk for North Pole Radio News. Just 68 full working days remain until Santa's launch and the tally of days behind posted at Santa's workshop has now dropped to 99 days, showing that another 18 days have been picked up in the effort. Elf Seymour: I might be the wrong person to ask that question to Holly, I'm just the weather guy. But I have been told to keep the weather watch open to various parts of the world for at least the next four weeks, so maybe that could give you some idea how long this part of the workshop crisis plan will be rolling.
