

Elf Frank Myrrh: Hello again from the North Pole News Desk, I'm Elf Frank Myrrh of North Pole Radio News. In this special edition of North Pole Radio News we're talking about how to become an elf. Joining us now is an elf who works with more new elves than anyone, Elf Crash Murphy, the International Director of Santa Trackers. Crash, we have a lot of believers coming to SantaUpdate.com who want to become an elf but don't know how. What would you say to them?

Elf Crash Murphy: I would say to read everything at SantaUpdate.com, then go to ElfHQ.com and read everything there. Then go to SantaTrackers.net and read everything there.

Elf Frank: That's a lot of reading, Crash. Is that really necessary?

Elf Crash: Yeah, it's necessary. Being an elf is a lot of work. And if you want to be Santa's elf you've got to be able to work like Santa does, which is a lot, Frank. Besides, if you go and you read all the websites it's going to answer most of your questions.

Elf Frank: What's the biggest problem new users have in becoming an elf?

Elf Crash: Having an email address that works.

Elf Frank: What do you mean?

Elf Crash: A lot of people wanting to become elves are young, Frank. They're still in school. And that's fine, Santa loves younger elves. But to sign up you gotta use the websites and to use the websites you have to have a working email. Many are using school email addresses or general email services like G-mail and those places sometimes don't like email from North Pole websites. I don't know why that is, but it is. If your email doesn't work, you just can't be an elf. We have to be able to communicate.

Elf Frank: So we see a lot of people sign up but they don't complete the process because their email doesn't work.

Elf Crash: Yes, that or they don't check with their parents first to see if it's okay. We actually prefer, when it's a younger person, that they sign up to be an elf WITH their parent, or for the parent to be an elf too. We want elves of all ages.

Elf Frank: So if someone signs up and they don't get the email, they can't be an elf.

Elf Crash: Right. You gotta have that at a minimum. We don't send you spam or ask you to buy anything ever. But the email is what makes it so an elf can be an elf on the North Pole websites.

Elf Frank: Ok, Crash. Good information.
