

NORTH POLE RADIO NEWS - TRANSCRIPT

Elf Frank Myrrh: Greetings once again from the North Pole news desk, I'm Elf Frank Myrrh of North Pole Radio News. We have reached the one-week mark in our countdown to Christmas and there are several breaking stories to cover as we now track the hours until Santa's launch. From North Pole Flight Command we connect once again with Elf Crash Murphy, Santa's eye in the sky reporter. Crash, what are the big stories that concern us right now?

Elf Crash Murphy: Frank, we have many areas of concern but the two biggest things going on right now are the crisis in Santa's workshop and the weather. Everything else appears to be just where we need it to be.

They are carrying the catchup work of Santa's workshop, which has been in crisis since late summer. They've been at it for weeks, launching sleigh after sleigh of stuff Santa will deliver on Christmas Eve, away from the North Pole and it's big storm coming in. They have made good progress but they need to make a lot more...and the weather could get in the way.
