

NORTH POLE RADIO NEWS - TRANSCRIPT

Elf Frank Myrrh: Hello once again from the North Pole News Desk, I'm Elf Frank Myrrh of North Pole Radio News. North Pole Flight Command has a lot of things going on right now between Santa's sleigh and Operation Air Lift but they remind us today of their ongoing needs for more tracker elves. Joining us today from Flight Command is the International Director of Santa Trackers, Elf Crash Murphy. Crash, we're putting the spotlight on Santa trackers today – why?

Elf Crash Murphy: Because we need more of them from every part of the world, Frank. The department put out a report the other day about how many tracker elves we have and while we have millions working for us now, we need millions more. Santa has called for up to five million more trackers and we're hoping we can find and quickly train those elves between now and when Santa takes off.

Elf Frank: Is there time for a new tracker to become an effective tracker?

Elf Crash: Yes, it's possible to make a solid contribution to the effort quickly if you believe in Santa and listen to your Elf Supervisor. Tracking Santa for Santa actually begins early in the year but there are things to get done even while Santa is in flight. I consider the next week or better to be the best training period for anyone serious about upping their skills in tracking Santa for Santa.

Elf Frank: So what are you suggesting someone who wants to help to do right now to help Santa?

Elf Crash: Well, get your merry butt in gear and go to ElfHQ.com and get some basic elf training under your belt and then directly go to SantaTrackers.net and join the elf community there. There is Elf University there and lots of helpful elves who will show you how to track Santa for Santa in the time we have left.
