

Regional Tracking Centers Opening Soon

North Pole Flight Command wasted no time after the locations for the regional tracking centers were announced in getting construction started on those locations. Joining us from Flight Command with an update on those projects is Elf Crash Murphy, Internation Director of Santa Trackers. Crash, the regional tracking centers affect your group significantly, don't they?

Elf Crash: Indeed, they do, Frank. They house our Elf Supervisors and their teams of trackers and they have charge over all of our field trackers out there. So we need them up and running so we can get to work.

Elf Frank: We hear the date of August 1st as the target for these centers. That's still several months before Santa takes flight, Crash. Why do those regional centers need to be up so early?

Elf Crash: Our work is to track Santa for Santa. We're not your garden variety Santa trackers, Frank. We spend months gathering information. We inspect roofs and chimneys, we build landing zones, we prepare weather reports and send in photos of obstacles, new developments, changes to roads and highways – the last third of the year is spent gathering information and sending it in to flight planners at North Pole Flight Command. Those regional centers organize and orchestrate all that work.

Elf Frank: And all that work goes on while you're still recruiting elves, correct?

Elf Crash: Correct. We need millions of them, Frank. We have a lot of work ahead of us before Santa launches.
